Architectural Rescue Shop (ARS)

The Jipp Home & Grocery

The grocery was built by German immigrant Christian Jipp in 1868 and was one of the early businesses north of mid-19thcentury Davenport. Jipp lived with his wife and three daughters in the back of store until the house was added in 1878 and operated the grocery until 1906. It continued as a private home and grocery until 1958 when it was converted to a Laundromat and rental apartments. In the early 1980's the store closed and the building remained boarded up for the next 20 years.

In 2004, after becoming #1 on the city's demolition list, it became Gateway Redevelopment Group's first restoration project.

Gateway Redevelopment Group (GRG)

GRG was formed by people with the desire to save the abandoned historic structures in the Hamburg Historic District.

Volunteers operate the Architectural Rescue Shop, selling architectural salvage to raise funds to maintain the shop and help preserve other endangered properties. The shop is also used to collect, store, repair and display these items from our past, as well as a place to tell the story of the Jipp. In addition to donations from individuals and local merchants, GRG has received major funding from the Riverboat Development Authority, the State Historical Society of Iowa, Davenport's HAPPEN program, Scott County Housing Council, Iowa Department of Natural Resources, Iowa's historic tax credit program and the Waste Commission of Scott County.
